## In Review: 2010

By the end of 2010, RECLAIM will have provided almost 100 LGBT youth with mental and Integrative Health Services (IHS) support. Of these youth, 85% report having been harassed due to perceived sexual orientation or gender presentation. 85% also report having considered suicide.

RECLAIM has been able to be a stable source of care in the lives of these youth despite the fact that 60% are without insurance. Unfortunately, we have had to turn away 50 requests for service due to lack of capacity to respond.

We engaged the MN Non-profit Assistance Fund to evaluate our organization. The consultant, **Steve Boland**, affirmed our status as a fiscal sponsee, supported the role of the advisory board and found that we had sound financial practices and were fiscally healthy. He also recognized the need to add a staff person to assist with development and

After a few meetings at RECLAIM one youth said, "I'm so grateful to be a part of the RECLAIM community." We celebrate that we are not just providing services, but indeed belong to one another in important ways. Daily, participants comment on how much it means to them to have a place like RECLAIM available in their lives.



## **Gender Exploration Group**

Although RECLAIM is only just over a year old, this group has been meeting every Thursday night for the last eight and a half years and is co-facilitated by Janet Bystrom, Alex Nelson and Mike Grewe.

On November 11<sup>th</sup>, the group had a reunion in which over 20 youth returned to express their gratitude and share memories. So many of them started by saying, "If it weren't for group, I seriously don't know where I would be."

This group is the place where young people begin to articulate their hopes and fears and encourage one another to find the strength to live their lives with authenticity and power.

#### **Gender Group Retreat**

In August, RECLAIM hosted a two-day retreat with 9 youth in Northern Minnesota. Planned by youth with the help of **Alex Nelson**, the re-

treat focused on themes of consent, self-care/protection and overall health and wellness all through the lens of gender identity. Diane Long, Susan Raffo and Nissa Phillips led group and individual exercises to encourage developing skills in body awareness and self-defense. Simple pleasures such as swimming in the lake, eating healthful food and sitting by the fire, were deeply appreciated by many.

## **Integrative Health Services**

The majority of the youth who seek support at RECLAIM have experienced severe physical and sexual abuse. The effects of abuse and multiple layers of marginalization are often internalized and manifested through substance abuse, eating disorders, smoking, and self-harm. RECLAIM has begun intentionally pairing complementary modalities of care such as acupuncture, massage, nutrition and chiropractic care to enhance and accelerate the benefits of talk therapy.

In her role as Volunteer Coordinator, **Diane Long** engages professional practitioners who give their time to provide individual on-going consultations to youth. We wish to thank **Diane Long**, **Rhys Preston and Christy Lillibridge** for initiating IHS services at RECLAIM and the **Rainbow Health Initiative** for providing financial support to more formally develop this model of care.
